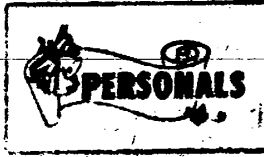

For the Grocery Specials of the week, in the Meat Department, just in time for that big weekend picnic, Corn King Skinless Wieners are 59c for a 12-oz. pkg.; Boneless Family Style Bottom Round Steaks are \$1.39 a lb.; and Ground Round is \$1.29 a lb. Boneless Rolled Chuck Roast is \$1.29 a lb.; Boneless Rolled Bottom Round Roast is \$1.39; Whole Pork Butt is \$1.19 a lb.; Wilson's Corn King Whole or 1/2 Semi-Boneless Ham is \$1.19 a lb.; and Boneless Quarter Hams are \$1.39.

In the Grocery Department, Campbell's Pork & Beans are 25c for a 1 lb. can; Del Monte Sweet Peas or Whole Kernel Corn is \$1 for 3, 1-lb. 1-oz. cans; Miracle Whip Salad Dressing is 89c a qt.; Mueller's Elbow Macaroni is 99c for a 3-lb. pkg.; Red & White Cat-sup is \$1 for 3, 14-oz. bits; and R&W PotatoChips are 69c for 9-oz. pkg.

In the Produce Department, Tomatoes are 29c a lb.; Cukes are 2 for 25c; Green Onions are 2 pkgs., for 25c and Carrots are 15c a lb.
