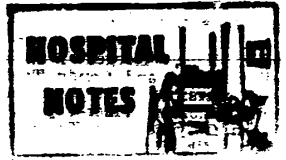

Bring table service, Tureen and beverage other than coffee — "Chicken Barbecue" planned. Reservations will be appreciated. Please pass the word around.

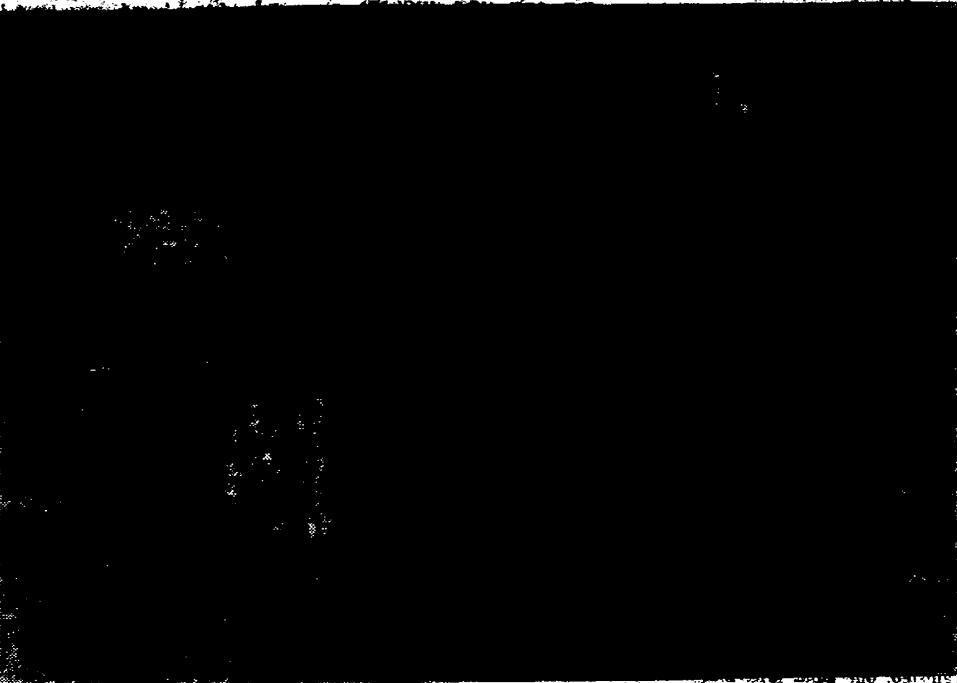
