Hi there folks! Well, after a rather damp Memorial Day weekend it looks as if we may be in for a few days of sunshine - which will certainly be a welcome change.

For our specials of the week, in the Meat Department, Beef prices are the best buys although there are a few other hot items that are in tune with picnic weather. Chuck Steaks are on a "Super Special" at 89c a lb.; Center Cut Chuck Steaks are 79c a lb.; Boneless Beef Chuck Roasts are 99c and Ground Chuck is also 99c a lb. Armour Star Hot Dogs are 89c a lb., along with Superior Polish Sausage; R & W Lunch Meats are \$1.19 a lb., and Columbia Sliced Bacon is 89c a lb.

In the Grocery Department, R & W Chunk Tuna is 43c for a 6 1/2 oz. can; R & W Elbow Macaroni is 89c for a 3-lb. pkg.; Our Value Salad Dressing is 59c a quart; Robin Hood Flour is 49c for a 5-lb. bag; Hunt's Peaches are 3.15-oz. cans for \$1; Hershey Chocolate Syrup is 39c for a pt. can; and Vanity Fair Bath Tissue is 39c for a 2-roll pack.

In the Produce Department Yellow Cooking Onions are 49c for a 3-lb. bag; Large Green Peppers are 2 for 25c; Florida Sweet Corn is 10c an ear; and California Navel Oranges are 10c each.

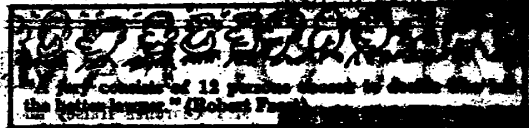
