"We expect students who complete the summer sessions to achieve the level of professional proficiency which we require after the first year of our curriculum," he continued. He noted that those in the accelerated program will spend about all day five days a week throughout the seven-week session.

Admission to the time-shortened degree program is open to any student who (1) is a graduate of a two-year food service program

and (2) those offered through the school. The graduate of a two-year school food service program; (2) has at least three years' experience in the field.

"Students who successfully complete this program will have the advantage of saving tuition, plus part of a year's room and board." In addition, of course, he or she will be graduated a year sooner than those who take the regular two-year program.

### Time-Shortened Degree Program In Food Service Now Available

A time-shortened degree program in food service will be offered for the first time starting this summer at the Alfred State College School of Vocational Studies in Wellsville.

"If there is sufficient interest, we will offer this unique program from June 30 through August 13," said Professor Deas Slocum, chairman of the Food Service Department.

He reports that the accelerated program offers several options since high school graduates may use it to obtain a degree in a shorter time span, while those already working in the food service field may benefit from enrichment of their skills.

Under the accelerated program, students may earn an associate in occupational studies degree by successfully completing a seven-week summer training program, followed by taking the senior year curriculum next fall. Thus, a student who enrolls this summer, may earn his degree in the spring of 1947.
