The Greenwood Central School Baccalaureate Service will be held Sunday evening, June 20, 1976 at 8:00 P. M., in the United Methodist Church. The Rev. Francis Erb, pastor of St. Mary's Church in Rexville, will be the speaker.

The Greenwood Central School Budget for 1976-77 of \$770,878, was defeated Tuesday, but not by the margin given in the Hornell Tribune. There were 86 who voted Yes, not 68; and 135 voted No.

The Board tried to inform the people through three Public Hearings. Some came to all three and some to two meetings, but never 100 or more. If you wanted to be informed, why didn't you come to one of three meetings.

Principal Moore said more older persons voted and fewer parents with children. The Board met after the vote count and discussion and voted to go on the Austerity Budget. That will about take us back to the District Schools, only some of them were getting a warm lunch.

The Board is not authorized to expend money for anything other than those items mandated by law. There are a lot of things required by the State that we don't get money to pay for them. The Cafeteria will be eliminated because it did not break even and Mrs. Brewster used a lot of surplus food other schools rejected. Transportation will not be provided within a two mile limit for elementary students and a three mile limit for high school students, also less pick-up points. Busses may not be used for Interscholastic Sports and Marching Band Parades. The only sports will be intermural and music programs at school. Instructional supplies, paper, crayons, pencils will not be provided, and of course, no free lunches for the needy.

Some found fault with teachers salaries. How many of you would take their place to see what it's like. Mr. Moore attended a meeting with State Education Department Officials in Albany, Friday, for Board Members and Administrators of Districts whose budgets have been defeated. Everyone knows that costs have gone up at home, can you expect less of the School District?

Tom Harkenrider won the election to a 5-year term on the School Board with 122 votes to June Sekoll's 78 and Brenda Yarnell's 34. Any change will have to come from public support. Tom is already serving on the Board as he was appointed to fill the vacancy by the resignation of John Driscoll.

School Election voting began at Noon and went until 8:00 P. M., when Virgil Hussey was Chairman of the meeting. A voting machine, not now used by the Town, was used, so the tally was soon taken. There were ten Senior Citizens helping with the voting and Board Clerk, Doris Bennett was present all eight hours. Tellers were Mrs. Daniel Redmond and Bryan Higgins. It was a difficult duty of Principal Gary Moore Wednesday to announce to the school children what had happened and what it would mean to them.

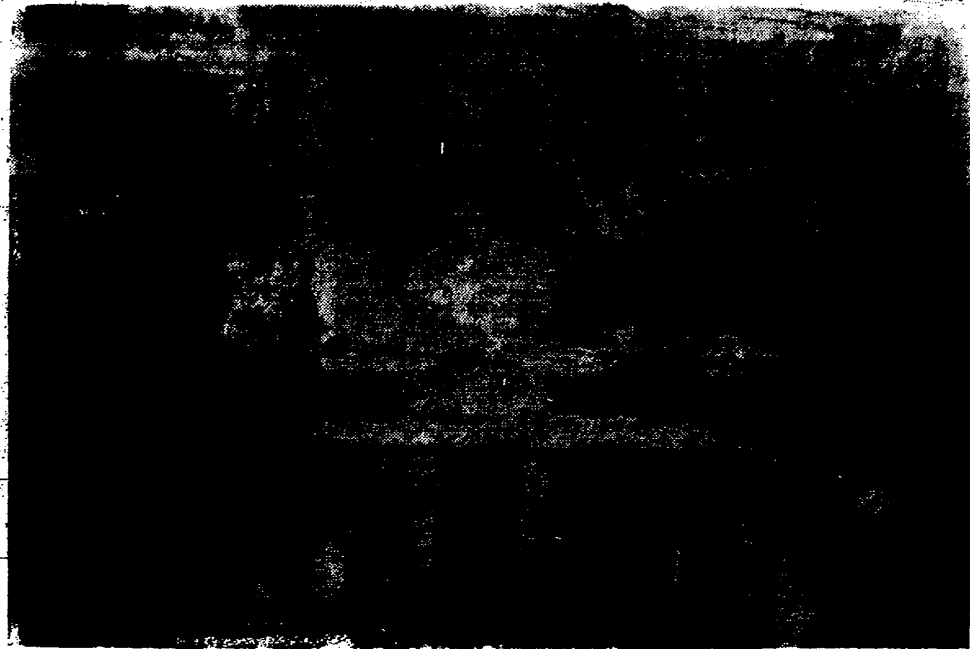
