The Greenwood Central School Budget for 1976-77 of \$770.878, was defeated Tuesday, but not by the margin given in the Horneli Tribune. There were 96 who voted Yes, not 68; and 135 voted No. The Board tried to inform the people through three Public Hearings. Some came to all three and some to two meetings, but never 100 or more. Transpertation will not be provided within a two mile limit for elementary students and a three mile limit for high school students, also less pick-up points. Busses may not be used for Interscholastic Sports and Marching Band Parades. The only sports will be intermural and music programs at school.
