## Dr. Leamer Named New Dean At Ag-Tech

Dr. Thomas Leamer of Cobleskill, has been named dean of the School of Agricultural Technologies at Alfred State Agricultural and Technical College.

The appointment was announced by Dr. David H. Huntington, president of Alfred State College, who said Dr. Leamer will assume his duties August 1.

Dr. Leamer has been a member of the faculty of the State University Agricultural and Technical College at Cobleskill since 1969 and chairman of the college's Plant Science Department since 1973.

As dean of Alfred's School of Agricultural Technologies, Dr. Leamer will supervise some 37 faculty members, included in the school which has an enrollment of about 580 are the departments of plant and animal science, agricultural industries, and ornamental horticulture.

Dr. Leamer earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees at Wisconsin State University in Platteville, Wisc., where he lettered in football and wrestling. In 1972, he received his Ph.D. from Pennsylvania State University where he also spent a year as a graduate assistant.

The new dean joined the Cobleskill State College faculty in 1969 as an assistant professor in the Plant Science Department after four years of teaching agriculture in Wisconsin at the high school level. He is also a former high school wrestling coach and continues to maintain an avid interest in sports.

As dean of the School of Agricultural Technologies, Dr. Leamer succeeds Professor William W. Stopper who retired several months ago.

Dr. Leamer, his wife, Susan, and their four children will be moving
