THE PANFISH KING

The first sunny days of Spring bring a rush of action in lakes and streams, Microscopic organisms, in sects, minnows and other forms of aquatic life shrug off the doldrums of winter in anticipation of better days shead.

What occurs next is sudden, and sometimes unexpected. Chasing this fresh blossoming of life are millions of slab-sided crappies, fish whose voracious appetites have been dormant for too long:
Black Lake in St. Lawrence County is famous for its crappie fishing, and the annual "explosion" there of angiling action is a good spring tonic and an excellent way to start the season.

Crappie fishing is one of the main features of spring and summer fishing throughout much of New York State. They're easy to catch, and are one of the tastlest fish you can put in a skillet. The two species of crappies (white and black) together are found in most of the U. S. They can thrive in both streams and lakes, but are most numerous in impoundments. Favored fishing methods call for light tackle, six to eight-poundtest line on spinning tackle, with minnows or small jigs for bait. Fly rods and appropriate lures also provide great sport. Look for crappies where there is cover such

as brush, logs, docks, piers, and flooded trees. They're shy fish, perferring to stay in the shade when not feeding.

In spring, crappies move into shallow water in search of food. They will stay there untily the spawning urge sends them to deeper water where spawning beds will be established.

As the months progress into summer, crapples move into deeper water, still staying near some kind of cover and shade. Rock piles are good places to search for them during warm weather.

You can locate summer crapple hot spots by drift fishing using a live minnow just off bottom. Don't let the boat drift too fast; almost all crapple fishing calls for slow steady action. Crapples mouth the lure or bait with a delicate tap. Another productive technique is

the lure or bait with a denuate tap.

Another productive technique is trolling. Put a live minnow over the stern with a small split shot pinched onto the line 12 inches ahead of the bait. Motor slowly along shore, keeping the lure deep and alongside available coper. along shore, keeping the lure of and alongside available cover.

But right now the action is faster — you can east small jigs into bays and coves, retrieve them in jerks over the tops of weeds, and the action can be very fast. The panfish king is on a spree!
