MILK & DAIRY Products — adequate. FRUITS & VEGETABLES — plentiful.

For "Specials of the Week" in the Meat Department: Frying Chickens family-pak are 45c a lb.; Boneless Beef Chuck Roast is 99c a lb.; Boneless Chuck Steaks are \$1.19 a lb.; Rolled, Boneless Chuck Roast is \$1.29; Boneless Round Steak is \$1.39; and Strip Steak is \$1.99 a lb.

In the Grocery Department, Del Monte light chunk Tuna is 40c for a 6 1/2-oz. can; Bison Brand Cottage Cheese is 69c a lb.; Scott Paper Tissue is 39c a box; Mi-Dri Paper

Towels are 39c for a jumbo roll; Blue Boy Corn or Peas are 3 cans for \$1; and Hunt's Ketchup is 37c for a 14-oz. bottle.

The 35 lap trophy event will award double points for competition. In addition, the full racing card of Limited Sportsman and Challengers will also compete on Saturday night.

Sunday, July 11, the 3 divisions switch to afternoon racing at Perry Motor Speedway in Perry, N. Y., with practice at 1:00 p. m., first race at 2:30 p. m.

Dick Flaig of Eggertsville, the 1975 Champion, has established himself as a pre-race favorite for the Mid-Season go. 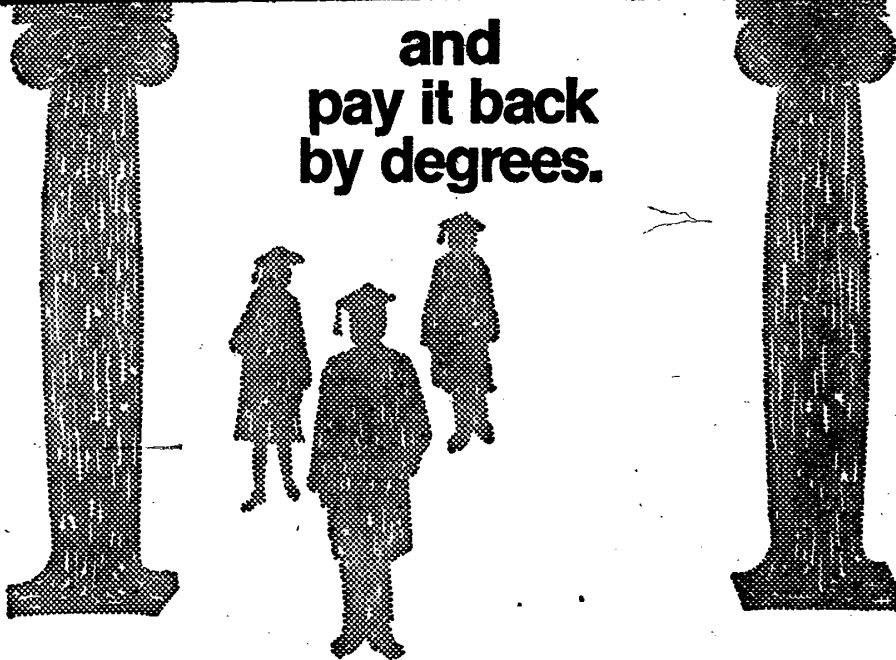
