

Andover Medical Center To Hold "Open House"

The Andover Medical Center operated by the "IRMAAC" plans to hold an "Open House" at their new building on Main Street in Andover on Sunday evening, the 25th of July, 1976, from seven to nine o'clock and extends an invitation to all area residents to stop in and meet the Doctors and Staff as well as inspect the new building.

The Medical Center is now staffed with three Doctors, Dr. Toby Atkins, Dr. William Coch, and Dr. Gary Onda which will enable the Center to announce the establishment of new visitation hours.

The new Medical Center has modern facilities consisting of 7 examining rooms; 3 private Doctor's Offices; a Laboratory; Nursing Office; a Conference Room; and in addition, the entire building is air-conditioned for year round comfort, and provides ample parking space for patients. For extended care, referrals are made to area Hospitals.

Andover Summer Playground

On Thursday, July 29, the Playground will visit the Genesee County Museum located in Mumfords, N. Y. The museum consists of over 30 historically significant village and farm structures settled on a 125-acre site in the Genesee Valley Region. The museum is sponsored by the Genesee Brewing Company Inc. and is a non-profit, educational institution chartered by the Board of Regents of the State University of N. Y.

This trip will be open to 40 children in grades 5 - 12. The cost will be \$1.25 per student, per mission slips will be available at the Playground on Monday, July 26 and may be returned anytime thereafter until the limit of 40 is reached. 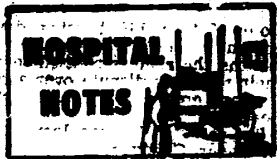
The Mayor's Column

Hearing Must Be Held Prior To License Revocation

Legislation sponsored by Assembly Assistant Minority Leader James L. Emery (R-Genesee), requiring that prior to the revocation of a domestic game bird breeders license or a shooting preserve license a hearing must be afforded to the licensee, has been signed into law by the Governor. Under New York State law, the State Department of Environmental Conservation regulates the acquisition and disposition of game birds, requires the marking of certain birds and the keeping of records and the filing of reports. The Department may revoke any license it has issued if the holder is convicted of violating any provisions of the licensing law, and no license will be issued to the convicted person for the next two years.

Assemblyman Emery said: "My purpose in sponsoring this legislation was to offer the accused license violator some opportunity to defend himself against any charges before his license is automatically revoked for two years. Under the provisions of my new law, the notice of the hearing must be provided by mail, witnesses may be subpoenaed and the revocation will be reviewed in the New York State Supreme Court.

"Establishing the policy of hearings before a game breeder's license can be taken away is consistent with our principle of equal justice and it also will aid a substantial segment of our state's economic community."
