

BEEF — plentiful. Production to average 4-6% above last year, and 12% above the past 2 year average. PORK — light. Production to be seasonally reduced, but up 10% from last year's unusually low level. POULTRY & EGGS — plentiful. Record marketings to be about 14% more than last year.

MILK & DAIRY PRODUCTS — adequate. Milk production should be well above last year; Butter is

7% lower and stocks are somewhat tight; however, American Cheese production is over 14% above past 3-year average.
