**FAMILY NIGHT AT HOLLAND**  
On Saturday, August 14, Holland International Speedway will hold its final Family Night for the season. The admission will be admitted for the low price of \$6.00.

The leading drivers at Holland include Dick Flagg of Eggertsville in the Late Model Sportsman division. Flagg was the 1975 Defending Champion and holds a 62 point edge over runner-up Art Clark of West Seneca. Both drive 1975 Camaros.

The Limited Sportsman division finds 1975 Charlie Neumann 20 points behind point leader Doug Bringle of Warsaw. Former drag race driver Vance Richeburg of Batavia is third with 48 points.

The Challenger division finds Starter who turned competitor Dave Sutton of West Valley leading the division with a 10 point edge over Rich Herbert of Warsaw. Third place is held down by rookie driver Brube Pikett of East Aurora who has 2 feature victories to his credit. Sutton drives a Dodge Charger, Herbert a Ford and Pikett a Chevrolet.

The crashy bang Kamikaze division finds Gary Schrader of Holland a slim 6 point edge over Mark Marks of Buffalo. Schrader has won 2 feature Kamikaze events while Marks has won 1 to date.

Racing at the popular oval gets underway at 7:30 p. m. with the first race scheduled for 8:00 p. m.
