In the Late Model Sportsman Division, Dick Flag, of Eggertsville, will attempt to maintain his first place status over Art Clark of West Seneca. Clark was dethroned after winning the championship in 1973 and 1974. Both competitors have competed at the Speedway since 1969.

Charles Neumann of Lockport, in the Limited Sportsman Division will be gunning for his third championship after winning top honors for two years in a row.
