length gown and carried a small bouquet of miniature carnations.

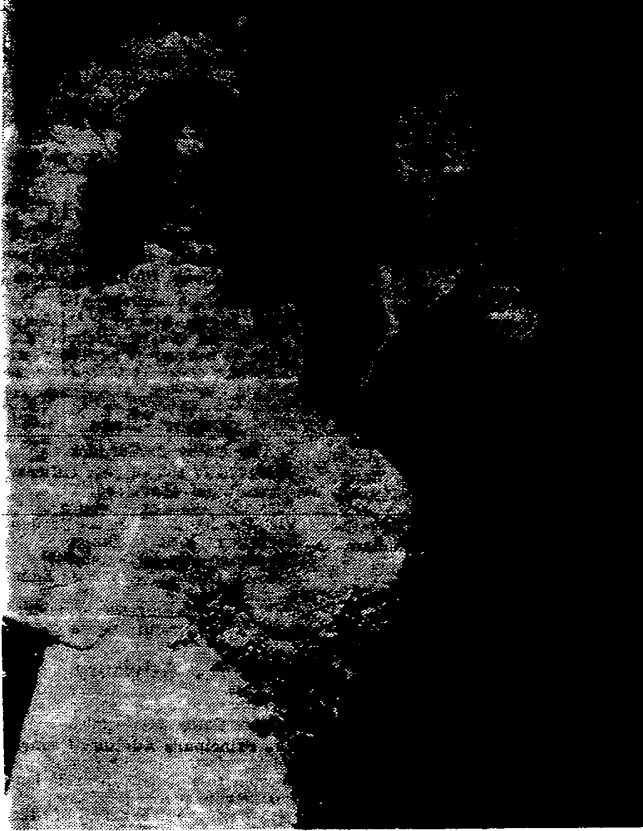

In the Pork Line, Combination Pork Chops are \$1.00 a lb.; Country Style Spare Ribs are \$1.29; and Center Cut Rib Pork Chops are \$1.49 a lb.
