## Scouts Mark Forbidden Trail

In 1974 the teachers at Andover Central School wrote a Bi-Centennial Project. During their planning they discovered that a section of the Forbidden Indian Trail once traveled by a Maraudian Miagonary David Zeisberger, passed through the Town of Andover. The route of his trail was known from Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, to Canoe and from Shongo, New York into Ohio, but the path followed from Canoe to Shongo was not identified.

Some area people, sponsored by the Andover Chamber of Commerce under the leadership of Alan Tuttle and Harriet Hoyer, investigated the location of this trail and identified its probable route.

The first marker on this part of the trail, a sign at the junction of Route 417 and the Shovel Hollow Road, will be erected on Saturday afternoon, October 9, 1976 at 2:00 p. m. by the Boy Scouts. A brief explanation of the significance of the trail will be given at the time of the marking and all interested people are welcome to attend. The Scouts will mark the remainder of the trail during the year as weather permits.

Copies of the research used in determining the location of this trail, including maps, will be placed in the Andover Free Library and will be available to the public during regular library hours.

To The People Of Andover:  
I really enjoyed my visit to Andover last weekend. It was wonderful to meet and talk to all of you. You are certainly a friendly group of people.

Many of you wanted the recipe for the milk punch that I served. Well, here it is. I hope that you all make it because it is a fantastic way to use milk, not only for the family, but for entertaining too!

### MILK PUNCH

- 1 pint vanilla ice cream, softened
- 2 cans (6-oz. each) frozen concentrate for either orangeade or limeade
- 5 cups milk
- 2 bottles (10-oz. each) sparkling water

In a mixing bowl or blender blend ice cream with concentrate. Gradually add milk. Pour into punch bowl; add sparkling water. For extra color you can add either orange or green food coloring to the punch before pouring. After the punch bowl, mix food coloring in berry tray floating scraps of sheet and slices of strawberries used in making the concentrate for the punch. For example, you could float orange slices, orange punch and lime slices in lime punch.
