Hi there Folks! How do you like the sample of "October's Bright Blue Weather" that we have been enjoying the first part of the week. The only trouble is that the weather man is predicting rain and colder weather.

For the Specials of the Week, the Meat Department really has some great ones going. In the Beef Line Round Steak is 99c a lb.; Boneless Round Steak and Ground Round is \$1.19 a lb.; Boneless Rolled Rump Roasts are \$1.49 a lb.; Sirloin Steak is \$1.49 a lb.; and T-Bone or Porterhouse Steaks are \$1.89. Red & White Semi-Boneless Hams are 99c a lb.; Boneless Pork Butt Roasts are 89c a lb.; Pork Steaks are 99c a lb.; and Pork Sausage is 99c a lb.

In the Grocery Department, R & W Red Kidney Beans are \$1 for 4 cans; Tomatoes are 3 cans for \$1; Mushrooms are \$1 for 2 — 4-oz. cans; Whole Kernel or Cream Style Corn is 4 cans for \$1; Peas & Carrots, 3 cans for \$1; Yellow Cling Peaches are 3 cans for \$1; Salad Oil is \$1 for a 1-qt. 6-oz. bot.; Mixed Vegetables are 3 cans for \$1; Chunk Tuna is \$1 for 2 6½-oz. cans; and Sliced Beets are 4 cans for \$1. R & W Margarine is 39c for a 1-lb. pkg.; Green Beans are 4 cans for \$1; Orange Juice is \$1 for 4 — 6-oz. cans; Saltines are \$1 for 2 — 1-lb. boxes; Chicken Noodle Soup is \$1 for 5 — 10½-oz. cans; and Vegetable Soup is \$1 for 5 — 10½-oz. cans.

In the Produce Department Carrots are 29c for a 2-lb. bag; Cauliflower is 59c a head; Yellow Cooking Onions are 49c for a 3-lb. bag; and Cortland or McIntosh Apples are 69c for a 3-lb. bag.
