Notice Of Public Hearing

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held on October 25, 1976 at 1:30 P. M. and 1:45 P. M. in the County Legislators' Chambers, County Court-house, Belmont, New York, in connection with two proposed local laws.

The first local law will establish an industrial and commercial incentive board pursuant to subdivision 8 of section 485-b of the Real Property Tax Law. Such board will advise the County Board of Legislators of the exercise of the County Board's options available pursuant to subdivision 7 of section 485-b of the Real Property Tax Law. Such board will also review the economic conditions of the County and make recommendations on the basis of such review to the County Board with respect to actions it deems desirable to improve the economic climate within the County. Such board will also possess such powers and duties as may be prescribed by the County Board. This local law also provides the number, term and expense reimbursement provisions for such board. This local law if adopted, will take effect on the date it is filed in the Secretary of State's Office.

The second local law will establish the annual salaries of certain county officers, to wit: County Attorney — \$19,500.00. Social Services Commissioner — \$17,000.00 Superintendent of Highways — \$16,500.00. Planning Director — \$15,500.00. County Treasurer — \$15,000.00. Director, Real Property Tax Services Agency — \$13,500.00. Personnel Officer — \$13,000.00. If adopted, the local law will take effect on January 1, 1977; provided, however, in the event the local law is filed in the office of the Secretary of State after January 1, 1977, then, in such event, the local law will take effect on the date of such filing.
