

Free Swine Flu Shots Set For Oct. 25-26

Andover District Health Officer Dr. Robert M. Conner announced that free Swine Flu vaccines will be available for Andover residents on Tuesday, Oct. 25, 1976 at Andover Central School from 2 to 5 p. m.

Physicians recommend that all residents 18 years and older take advantage of the free immunization clinic. Persons 65 years and older and other residents in high risk areas, such as those with chronic lung disease, heart disease, diabetes and other chronic disorders will receive the trivalent vaccine which combines Swine Flu with a Victoria Influenza vaccine. All others will receive the monovalent vaccine. Both of these vaccines will be available at each clinic.

Immunization will be administered by 3 specially trained local Emergency Medical Technicians using the "amulets" pens under the supervision of the County Public Health Nurses. The clinic will be staffed by local volunteer Red Cross Nurses. It is suggested that local residents wear short sleeved clothing when they appear for their immunization shot.

Persons receiving the vaccine will be required to sign a consent form which will be kept on file by the County Health Department.

Vaccine will also be available free of charge for their private patients although Physicians have the right to charge for the administration of the vaccine at their offices.

Although immunization of well children under 18 is not recommended at this time, a special bivalent vaccine is available for high-risk children from ages 3-18. This includes children with heart disease, pulmonary disease such as asthma and cystic fibrosis, kidney disease, diabetes, and malignancies. This vaccine will be given in two doses one month apart. This vaccine will be available only at private physician's offices.

Vaccine will not be given to persons having any of the following conditions: those persons allergic to eggs; those with fever at the time of the clinic; and those who have received another type of vaccine within the past two weeks.

Public Health Nurses will vaccinate home bound patients at the Physicians' requests and also will supply vaccine to nursing homes, hospitals, colleges and industries for administration by qualified staff personnel.

For the convenience of patrons of the Andover Medical Center immunization shots will be available at the Center at a nominal charge of \$5 to cover the cost of the administration and the necessary paper work.

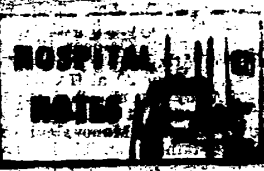
Local Artist's Works Now On Display

Named To Babe Ruth "Athletes of The Year"

Patrick Earl Atwell, 8 Chestnut Street, Andover, N. Y., 14806, has been selected to Babe Ruth Baseball's "Athletes of the Year" program for 1976, as announced by Richard W. Case, President of Babe Ruth International, and Carl Atwell, Manager - Allegany County, Andover.

Nominations for "Athletes of the Year" were made earlier this summer by Babe Ruth league managers and presidents from across the nation. They were invited to nominate candidates with the best records of local achievement or their teams or in their leagues.

Criteria by which these local baseball players were nominated include the athlete's athletic ability, including statistics and overall performance, sportsmanship and personal leadership displayed during the current season. To be eligible for the program, a player must have been an active participant in an officially recognized Babe Ruth league during the 1976 season.

Sponsored by Babe Ruth International, "Athletes of the Year" is an annual program which pays tribute to the team players from the world's largest regulation baseball activity for young people. The purpose of the program is to promote and encourage the playing of amateur Babe Ruth Baseball among young athletes between the ages of 12 and 18 by nation, and recognizing each team's outstanding players of the current season.

The athletic achievements of each local honoree will be presented in the 1976 edition of BABE RUTH BASEBALL, "ATHLETES OF THE YEAR" annual to be published in December. This respect-ful tribute of the youth baseball season will be presented to the Baseball Hall of Fame at Cooperstown, N. Y. for permanent display.
