The Central School Board held their regular meeting at the school Monday night with several matters of business. The Board continued the program of hearing presentations from different staff members about school operation begun at the September meeting when the topic was the grounds building and transportation. Monday night teachers of grades K - 2 explained programs and procedures followed by a 45-minute discussion period. School Administrator Gary Moore said he has initiated the program since it "is the purpose of the School Board to be knowledgeable about what is going on in the school". He said the program is being well received by both Staff and Board Teachers of grades 4 - 5 - 6 participate in the November meeting.

Board authorized Principal Moore to investigate the problem in the school roof over the Cafeteria, Shop and Spower Room causing a leak which cannot be found. He will also investigate the possibility of replacing the double glass doors in a cold area at the end of the swimming pool with cinder blocks and concrete. He was also authorized to have the two doors leading to the shower rooms repaired.

The Board accepted the gift of 12 x 60 mobile homes from BOCES. These are HUD trailers and will be used for storage of athletic and grounds and maintenance equipment. The only cost to the District will be the transportation to Greenwood.

The Board approved the sale at bid of several surplus items including an air compressor \$36; a drill stand \$11; a three gang lawn mower \$45; an 80 gallon hot water heater \$65; two single phase three horse power mowers at \$40 and \$46. Mr. Moore was directed to advertise for bids on other surplus property. The Board awarded the bid for a water conditioning system to Greenwood Servi Soft Inc., at \$2825, subject to approval by the Health Department. The Board named Mrs. Donna Tracy and Mrs. Valerie Atherton as Cheerleading Coaches at \$125 each

Both are former cheerleaders.

The Board decided to conduct District Elections as in the past and declined to adopt a voter registration program. The policy for use of the School Cafeteria by the Toward Team on Saturdays was approved. It calls for the person being named responsible for the Gym and the Cafeteria.

The Board approved the new federal standards for School buses which will be effective April 1, 1977 and will require that all new buses be equipped with air conditioning and that the cost of these buses be shared by the State and the District. The Board also approved a resolution to support the consolidation of the three Boards and the Greenwood School District.

A joint meeting of the three Boards was held Tuesday night at Jasper with Richmond Young of the State Educational Department Bureau School Reorganization, Steuben County District School Supt. Dr. Richard E. McDonald, the three Principals and Jasper Clerk Homer Morton, Board Members from Greenwood were Patricia Higgins, Thomas Harkenrider and Charles Smith. The Boards agreed to have information about the proposed consolidation prepared to inform their voters. Public meetings will be held in each District and facts and figures made available. Another meeting is scheduled and McDonald was named press informant.

This has been under consideration for some time and each District has had a study made by David Rossi of Thomas Associates. The study includes a new high school in a central location. The New York State Education Dept. has reviewed the Rossi study and made no formal reaction. Dr. McDonald said incentive aid for both operating costs and building construction is available for a consolidated school district. All information will be developed by the three Boards before petitions for consolidation are circulated.

Mrs. Luella E. Stephens, 86, widow of Frank Stephens, died at the Bath Infirmary, Saturday, October 9. She was a native of Whitesville and married first to Frank Hoff of Greenwood. She lived in Hornell 65 years before going to Bath.

She was survived by two daughters, Mrs. Norma McMind and Mrs. Madeline Carlin, both of Hornell; a sister, Mrs. Clara McCaffery of Bath; four grandchildren, 11 great-grandchildren and three great-great-grandchildren.

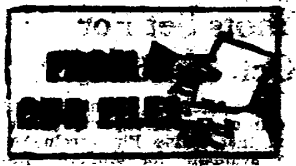

The 25th Annual Reunion of the Erley family will be held at the home of Jay Burdick in Elm Valley Saturday, August 15.

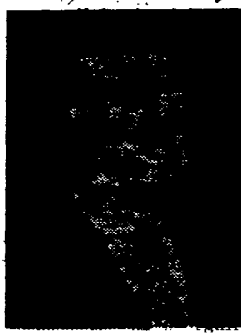
