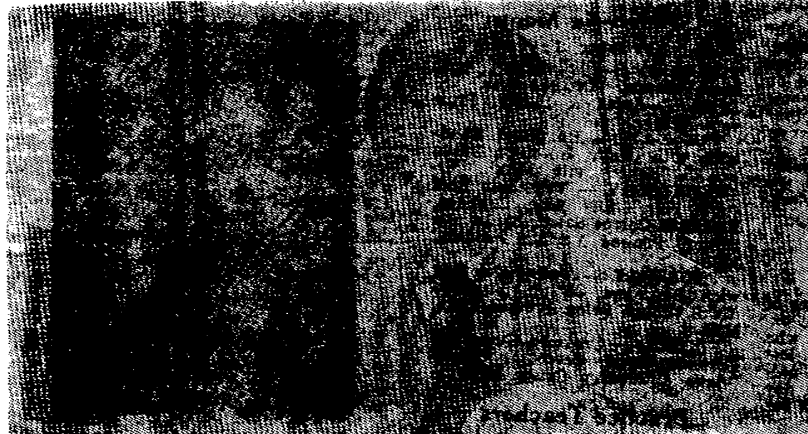

As Mayor, Stan Lundine learned how to balance a budget. He thinks it's time the Congress learned.



While Stan Lundine was Mayor of James town, he submitted a balanced budget 6 years in a row. Five of those 6 years he succeeded in not raising city taxes. He increased public services without any increase in the tax rate. Now he thinks the federal government should be able to do as well.

This year, the Congress had to vote on a budget with a \$50 billion deficit. Although it was sponsored by the leaders of his own party, Stan voted NO. He couldn't support a deficit of the size which put too much money into income maintenance and not enough into job protection.

"We can talk about a balanced budget," Stan said, "but until more Americans are back at work we'll never have one."
