

Mulholland Wins County Election By Large Vote

"Jim" Mulholland, local incumbent for Allegany County Treasurer, carried Andover by a huge 6-1 majority and was re-elected to Office by a 2-1 vote across the County in Tuesday's Election.

"Jim" Emery, incumbent State Assemblyman from this District carried Andover by nearly a 2-1 majority and was re-elected by an overall 2-1 majority throughout the District.

Likewise, State Senator Jess Present carried Andover by over a 2-1 majority and won handily over his opponent Frank Bratt rolling up over a 2-1 majority across this Senatorial District.

All Republican candidates carried Andover by well over a 100 vote majority except Representative Lundine who ran more than 70 ahead of the rest of his party, and Wellsville Mayor Gardner who ran 13 votes ahead of the Carter ticket.

Senator Buckley carried Andover by over a 2-1 majority but lost out in his race due to the large majority run up by Moynihan in the New York City and other highly industrial areas.
