TAKE NOTICE: A public hearing will be held by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Andover Allegany County, N. Y., on Monday, December 13, 1976, at 7:00 P. M., at the Village Hall on Main Street, Andover, New York on the proposed Open Container Local Law for the Village of Andover Allegany County, N. Y.

The following is a copy of the proposed Open Container Local Law for the Village of Andover Allegany County, N. Y.:

No person shall carry, transport or have in his possession on any Village Street within the Village of Andover, or on any Village property, or in any Village Building, any open, re-sealed or partly opened bottle, can, container, or similar article containing alcoholic beverage of any kind or description.

Any person found guilty of violating this Local Law shall be fined not less than Ten (\$10.00) nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each offense.
