WEAL INCENTIVE BOARD A LOCAL LAW IN RELA-THON TO ESTABLISH-ENG AN INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL ENCENTIVE BOARD.

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby established an industrial and commencial insentive board for the bounty of Allegany pursuant to flubdivision eight of section four itundred eighty-five-b of the real property tax law.

1.2. Such hoard shall advisa

groperty tax law.

Such board shall advise the Allegany County Board of Legislators at such time or times as the Board of Legislators of the Evercise of the Board of Legislators options available pursuant to subdivision sever of section four hundred eighty five-g of the real property tax law. Such board shall also review the economic conditions of the county of Allegany and make recommendations on the basis of such review to the Board of Legislators with respect to actions it deems desirable to improve the economic climate within said county. Such board shall also possess such powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Legislators.
