**Notice Of Public Hearing On Open Container Local Law No. 1 For The Village Of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y.**

TAKE NOTICE: A public hearing will be held by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y., on Monday, December 18, 1974, at 7:00 P. M., at the Village Hall on Main Street, Andover, New York on the proposed Open Container Local Law for the Village of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y.

The following is a copy of the proposed Open Container Local Law for the Village of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y.:

No person shall carry, transport or have in his possession on any Village Street within the Village of Andover, any open container of any beverage of any kind, including beer, wine, or liquor, which has been opened, or which is capable of being opened, or which contains a beverage of any kind, except as provided in this Local Law.

Any person found in violation of this Local Law shall be fined not less than twenty dollars (\$20.00) and not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each violation.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the following Local Law No. 2 of 1974 which became effective October 29, 1974, is published pursuant to Section 214 (2) of the County Law:

**COMMERCIAL INCENTIVE BOARD - A LOCAL LAW IN RELATION TO ESTABLISHING AN INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL INCENTIVE BOARD.**

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby established an industrial and commercial incentive board for the county of Allegany pursuant to subdivision eight of section four hundred eighty-five-b of the real property tax law.

Section 2. Such board shall advise the Allegany County Board of Legislators, at such time or times as the Board of Legislators may require, of the exercise of the Board of Legislators' options available pursuant to subdivision seven of section four hundred eighty-five-g of the real property tax law. Such board shall also review the economic conditions of the county of Allegany and make recommendations on the basis of such review to the Board of Legislators with respect to actions it deems desirable to improve the economic climate within said county. Such board shall also possess such powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Legislators.

Section 3. Such board shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Board of Legislators. A member shall continue to hold office until his successor is appointed and has qualified. Such board shall select its own chairman and such other officers it desires from its members. The members of such board shall receive no compensation for their services, but shall be entitled to the necessary expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in the discharge of their duties.

Section 4. This local law shall take effect on the date it is filed in the Office of the Secretary of State.
