Inside The State Capital

When the Governor held a press conference last week to announce what he termed a billion dollar budget "gap," it must have come as quite a shock to everyone who has been under the impression that our state now had a balanced budget.

If the public is enlightened, it's no wonder that the Governor really has to be able to deliver not simply an itemized list of bills, but all those specifics that the taxpayers know the state had a balanced budget. Mr. Carey's announcement to the effect that the "annual war" between the budget and the Governor's pocketbook was over, pointing the prospect of a balanced budget for the state in 1977, there may well be a lesson.

If the public and taxpayers are ever to have a clear and accurate picture of this state's fiscal situation, they must demand that these resources be restored and be at their disposal. What the Governor has done in this regard in the past year is a clear violation of the spirit and intent of new Freedom of Information laws now on the books, and we all have a right to know.

Meanwhile, if Mr. Carey told the press anything at this recent press conference that they didn't already know, that would have been news. He implied the state's belittling attempt to close the so-called "gap" would have to come primarily with deep cuts in the welfare and Medicaid areas.

We all remember the calls for a Special Session of the Legislature to deal with the welfare and Medicaid rises, the pleas from county officials to the governor, and all of it falling on deaf ears.

At the same time Mr. Carey is calling for deep cuts in these programs, the Democrat-controlled Assembly Ways and Means Staff under Speaker Stanley Steingut and Chairman Burton Nacht — both of Brookton — has issued a slick orange report of a so-called "in depth study of the Medicaid problem."

If they are serious and if the Governor means what he is saying, then let them pass some of the legislation already in the hopper concerning Medicaid and welfare reform.

One of these, for instance, was just re-filed last week and would have all enrollees between 16 and 60 with no dependents under 18 and most college-level students ineligible for state Home Relief.
