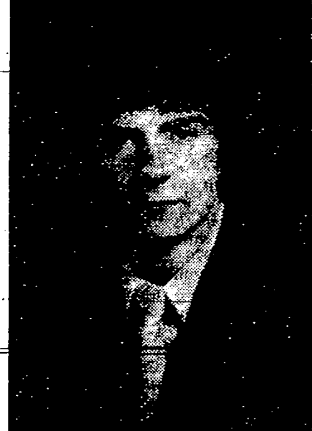

Six Andover Central School Students Receive N. Y. State Scholarships

Five Seniors in this year's graduating class at Andover Central School have won New York State Regents College Scholarships this year. These Seniors are: Teresa M. Joyce; Stephen D. Stewart; William J. Walker; Scott D. Wilson and Anita D. Winslow.

In addition to this, Marcy Jackson won a Regents Professional Education in Nursing Scholarship.

Marcy Jackson is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Jackson of East Avenue and is an ACS Senior.

Marcy has participated in several activities during the past four years. She has been in the National Honor Society, Nurses Aid Club and a member of the cheerleading and soccer teams for three years. Marcy has also been a member of the Girls' Athletic Association, four years; her Junior Class Treasurer; and sang in the All-County Choir for one year. She is presently the co-editor of the 1977 Yearbook.

Marcy is majoring in Math and Science. She plans to attend either Alfred Tech. or Corning Community College to pursue a career in Nursing.

Each Regents Nursing Scholarship entitles the recipient to an award of \$250 a year, for up to 5 years of nursing study at a college or at a hospital school of professional nursing in New York State. Scholarship winners may also receive an award of up to \$1,500 a year under the Tuition Assistance Program (TAP).

Teresa Marie Joyce, daughter of Charles and Lorraine Joyce of Andover, has won a N. Y. State Regents College Scholarship.

Teresa has been very active in her four years of high school. She has been on girls' soccer for four years; volleyball for four years; girls' basketball for four years; tennis and cheerleading for one year. She was selected for the Allegany County Girls Basketball All-Star Team.

She has been in the National Honor Society for three years, and on the Principal's Advisory Council for two years.

She has been in Student Council for four years where she was elected President and Vice-President. She was the President of the GAA for two of her four years of participation.

Teresa has received many awards here at Andover. She was awarded the American Legion Award in memory of Frank McKibbin, she took second place History Award. She was presented with the DAR Good Citizens Award and placed second in county competition.

Teresa's majors include Math and Science. She plans on going on to college for Physical Education and Athletic Training.

Each Regents College Scholarship entitles the recipient to an award of \$250 a year for up to 5 years of study at an approved program in New York State.

The basis on which these Scholarships are awarded is according to the score in the Regents Scholarship and College Qualification Test. This is a 6-hour test administered each year measuring high school achievement and general academic ability.

During the past month the Village received ANTIRECESSION FISCAL ASSISTANCE. These monies are authorized by Title II of the Public Works Employment Act of 1976. The funds are paid to eligible governments which have assured the Treasury Department that all of the provisions of the law will be observed. The amounts to respective governments will vary according to the status of the unemployment rate.

The money is to be used to maintain services and in theory, prevent unemployment. Andover received its first payment as did other governments in late Fall.

The Board has decided to use the funds to maintain a "Special Labor" position that was created to complete a number of projects as the inclement weather was approaching. Mr. Don Neeley serves in this position and as a result, of the Antirecession funds, his position will be maintained.
