A Public Hearing on Local Law No. 1 was held at the Village Office at 7:30 p. m. on January 10, 1977.

Mayor Bruce had a number of items on the proposed Local Law which were read to the Board. Several persons appeared opposing the local law. The Mayor declared the hearing closed at 7:30.

Karl Graves moved, seconded by Harold Rice, that WHEREAS a Public Hearing has been held on an open container Local Law No. 1:

No person shall carry, transport or have in his possession on any Village Street within the Village of Andover, or on any Village property, or in any Village Building, any open, re-sealed or partly opened bottle, can, container, or similar article containing alcohol beverage of any kind or description.

Any person found guilty of violating this Local Law shall be fined not less than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than (\$50.00) for each offense.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Local Law on open containers is hereby adopted and will take effect on the 23rd day of December after publication and posting as required by Village Code.

This concluded the business and the hearing was closed.
