Legal Notice

Notice To Harborers Or Owners Of Dogs

Dog Licenses are due on or before January 1, 1977. They may be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office.

The law requires that dogs be licensed by January 1. Failure to obtain a license subjects the owner to a penalty of \$10.00 and costs and the dog is liable to seizure.

The Commissioner of Health has issued an order requiring all dogs six months of age or over in the County to be vaccinated to prevent rabies. Therefore an applicant for a dog license must present to the Clerk a certificate certified by a duly licensed veterinarian showing that the dog has been so vaccinated.

To be acceptable the certificate presented must show that modified live virus vaccine was used within four years immediately preceding the application date or the killed vaccine of brain tissue or brain tissue origin was used within the year immediately preceding the application date.

If your application is mailed to the Clerk the vaccination certificate must accompany your application and check.

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to Titles 7 & 8 of Article 17 of the Environmental Conservation Law of New York State for the administration of and the issuance of permits under said law.

Alfred Station, New York 14803 has filed an application for a permit to discharge 4,000 gallons per day of treated process wastes to a tributary of Canacadea Creek and 250 gallons per day of sanitary wastes into groundwater from a subsurface disposal system at the applicant's facility located at Route 244, Alfred (T) Allegany County, where the applicant operates a poultry slaughtering, packing and processing business. This is an existing discharge.

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation tentatively intends to issue a State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) permit for the subject discharge(s). A final issuance will follow: (1) review of the application to assure compliance with all applicable provisions of Article 17 of the Environmental Conservation Law of New York State and all applicable provisions of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972; (2) development of special conditions setting forth specific effluent limitations and other controls applicable to the discharge(s) described above including schedules of compliance; (3) development of monitoring and reporting requirements for the applicants performance; (4) consideration of all written comments from persons who qualify, as described below, as interested parties on this notice of application.

Any person interested in this application who wishes to comment thereon or become an interested party in any proceeding regarding this application must notify the undersigned in writing stating specific areas of interest on or before February 14, 1977. All such written comments will be retained by the Department and considered in the formulation of the final determination. Any such interested party will be eligible to be heard if a public hearing is ultimately held in connection with this application.
