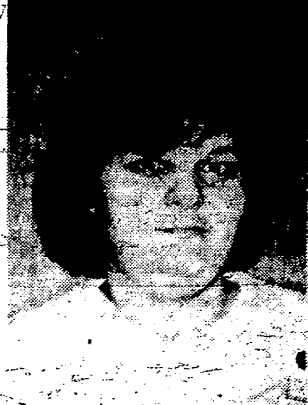
Students learned to install, operate and repair field radio, relay carrier and associated equipment. The private entered the Army in July 1976.

Mrs. Judi Grant of Scio, a member of the Andover Medical Center staff, has successfully completed her medical education at State University's Upstate Medical Center in Syracuse.

The 1969 graduate of Alfred State Agricultural and Technical College was sponsored for the eight-month program by Rural Management Association of Allegany County which operate the Andover Center.

Mrs. Grant received certification as an adult medicine nurse practitioner (AMNP) after four months of training under Drs. Henry Atkins II and William Coch of the Andover Center and four months of extensive training at Upstate Medical Center.

Training for her specially emphasized instruction in treatment of illness and health maintenance of patients aged 15 and older. The academic program included extensive training in medical history taking, physical examination techniques, disease identification treatment, and health education. While at Upstate, Mrs. Grant obtained clinical experience at several Syracuse area hospitals.

At the Andover Center, Mrs. Grant's duties include seeing patients by appointment, making home visits, and assisting the doctors in emergency care.

In addition the center is staffed by three physicians and a number of other medical personnel.

A graduate of Alfred State College's associate degree nursing program, Mrs. Grant, the former Hornell is a 1967 graduate of Hornell High School. She was supervisor and coronary care nurse at Jones Memorial Hospital in Hornell for two years before joining the Andover Center two years ago.

Mrs. Grant, who resides in Scio with her husband, Wayne, and their daughter, is a past treasurer and former member of the board of directors of the Alfred State Technical Alumni Association.
