Registration**

TAKE NOTICE that at a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Andover, held on the 10th day of January 1977, Elmo Barden moved that:

WHEREAS in compliance with Section 4-426 of the Village Law which states that no person shall be entitled to vote at any Village election unless he does not appear on the register of the district in which he claims to be entitled to vote.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that two inspectors of election be appointed to meet on the 26th day of February 1977 at the Grange Hall in the Village of Andover between the hours of 12 noon and 2 P. M. to prepare a register of voters qualified to vote in the Village election district for which they were appointed, by copying such names from the Village Register for the last preceding general election and covering the names of the Village Election District of all persons qualified to vote at the forthcoming Village election except the names of such voters as are known to have ceased to be voters in such district and by adding thereto the names of all persons known to them who will at the time of such election be qualified to vote thereat.
