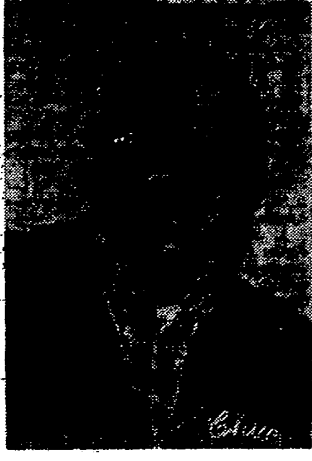


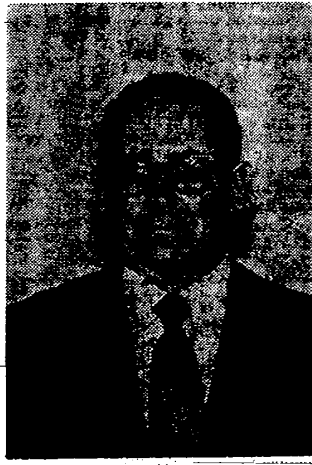

## Republicans Make Clean Sweep In Tuesday Election

For the first time in several years, the Andover Republican party made a "clean sweep" in Tuesday's Election and now have a full Republican board. Republican Candidate Ralph "Red" Allen scored the highest vote polling 176 votes for Mayor with two write-ins for Robert Baker, and one write-in for "Mike" Brace. In the contest for Trustees for 2 years, Republican Candidate "Chuck" Dain chalked up 157 votes with Ann Appier polling 150 votes. "Fred" Middaugh, running unopposed for Trustee for one year polled the most votes for Trustees with a total of 166. Democrat Candidate John Hyland, a newcomer to the political field, came in with an impressive 124 votes and, if there hadn't been a large turn out of 256 voters at the polls, he may easily have taken one of the two year slots.

## Planning Boards Meet To Discuss Fire Hall Proposal

The Andover Village and Town Planning Boards met at the Town Hall Offices, March 14, 1977 at 7:30 p. m., regarding the Fire Hall Complex. Frank Russell, Chairman of the meeting, reviewed the progress to date of the combined Boards' efforts to seek funding through the Public Works Act. The application is currently ranked 259-th with little hope for approval for construction of an emergency fire hall complex through this government agency.

An alternative has been explored by the Firemen and the Planning Boards. Herald Ford & Son, Inc. have proposed a plan to construct a fire hall for the Town and Village of Andover for approximately \$90,000. This would be done thru the local tax structure. It was recommended that the Firemen request additional funds from the Village and Town Boards for the proposed construction. Currently each Board's budget allotment to the Firemen is \$4,000. The new request would be \$7,000 from each board, with the increase reflected in construction of a fire hall.

A public meeting will be held at the Andover Fire Hall, Sunday, March 20, at 2:00 p. m. All citizens are urged to attend this meeting. The plan of the building, improved facilities, and local tax funding will be explained. Please attend.
