Frank Russel, Chariman of the meeting, reviewed the progress to date of the combined Boards' efforts to seek funding through the Public Works Act The application is currently ranked 259-th with little hope for approval for construction of a emergine fire hall complex through this government agency.

An alternative has been explored by the Firemen and the Planning Boards. Herald Ford & Son, Inc. have proposed a plan to construct a fire hall for the Town and Village of Andover for approximately \$90,000. This would be done thry the local tax structure.
