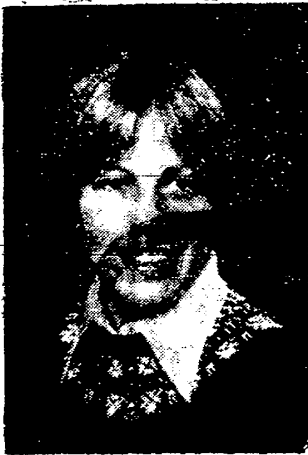

Mrs. RoseMary Burger, a member of the State Instruction and Professional Development Committee of New York State Educators Association attended a workshop presented at Binghamton, February 18 - 20. The workshop was for teachers of New York State.

The main speaker was Shirley Chissoem who talked about the responsibilities of teachers to improve education and make it available to everyone.
