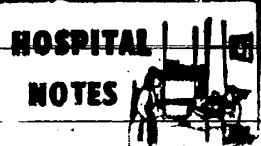
## NOTICE!

Allegany County Department of Health will be holding monthly immunization clinics at the Wellsville Lutheran Church every fourth Thursday from 2 p. m. to 4 p. m. Parking is available and participants of the clinic are requested to use the rear door of the church. The clinic is available to all pre-school children and school children with parent consent. Patients are requested to bring previous immunization records to the clinic.

State law requires that all children enrolled in school must be immunized against Polio, Measles (German and Regular) DPT and Mumps (as of March 1, 1977).

At the present time mumps vaccine is being made available to pre-school aged children only as supplies are limited.
