BOND RESOLUTION DATED FEBRUARY 14, 1977.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF AN ADDITIONAL \$25,000 SERIAL BONDS OF THE VILLAGE OF ANDOVER, ALLEGANY COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF ACQUISITION OF CONSOLIDATION AND INSTALLATION OF SUBSTATION EQUIPMENT AND FACILITIES FOR THE ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM OF SAID VILLAGE.

WHEREAS, by a resolution heretofore adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Andover, Allegany County, New York on May 13, 1974, said Village has authorized the issuance of \$100,000 serial bonds of said Village to pay the cost of acquisition and installation of new substation equipment as part of the electric distribution system of said Village; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to provide for the financing of such additional costs; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Andover, Allegany County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The specific object or purpose of the Village of Andover, Allegany County, New York a part of which is to be financed by the serial bonds hereinafter authorized, is the acquisition and installation of new substation equipment including construction of any necessary building to house such equipment as a part of the electric distribution system of said Village at Maple Street in said Village.

Section 2. The maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is now determined to be \$125,000 (an increase of \$25,000) and the plan for the financing thereof is as follows:

- a) By the issuance of \$100,000 serial bonds of said Village heretofore authorized to be issued by the bond resolution dated May 13, 1974 described in the preambles hereof; and
b) By the issuance of an additional \$25,000 serial bonds of said Village hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. The following determinations are hereby made:

- a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the aforesaid specific object or purpose is thirty years pursuant to subdivision 5 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law computed from December 31, 1974, the date of the first borrowing therefor;
b) The maximum maturity of the serial bonds herein authorized to be issued will exceed five years; and
c) no down payment is required pursuant to the provisions of subdivision 3 (d) of paragraph d of Section 107.00 of Local Finance Law

Section 4. The faith and credit of said Village of Andover, Allegany County, New York, are here-

Each petition must be directed to the clerk of the district, must be signed by at least twenty-five qualified voters of the district must state the name and residence of the candidate, and must describe the specific vacancy for which the candidate is nominated including at least the length of the term of office and the name of the last incumbent.

by irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property in said Village a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized including renewals of such notes is hereby delegated to the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner as may be prescribed by said Village Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Village is not authorized to expend money; or
2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of publication; or
3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 7. Upon this resolution taking effect, the same shall be published in full in The Andover News, the official newspaper, together with a notice of the Village Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 8. This resolution if adopted subject to permissive referendum.
