**SPECIAL MEETING  
BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

A Special Meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office, March 29th at 7:30. Those present: J. Michael Brace Mayor; Avery Mead and Karl Graves, Trustees; Mayor Elect Ralph Allen; Trustees Elect, Fred Middleaugh and Charles Dain; also Merle Fox, Chairman of the Village Planning Board and Richard Schrader of the Andover Fire Department.

Mr. Robert Strimple who had been interviewed for the position of Police Sergeant for the Village was present and declined the offer of employment. The vacancy in the Police Department remains vacant.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Avery Mead to deny the request of Ronald Allen for the Village to assume financial responsibility for thawing of his water line.

Merle Fox, Chairman of the Planning Board and Richard Schrader, President of the Andover Fire Co., were present to request the board to re-negotiate the contract with the Fire Co., and to raise the amount to \$7,000.00 per year to finance the construction of a new fire hall complex. After much discussion it was moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Avery Mead to include the raise of \$3,000, making a total of \$7,000.00 per year for the Fire Co. in the tentative budget now being prepared for 77/78.

Karl Graves gave a report on the meeting of the Route 21 Association held in Alfred.

Moved by Avery Mead and seconded by Karl Graves to issue building permits to Joyce Management Corp. for construction of 2 houses on Rt. 417.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Avery Mead to issue a building permit to Stephen Goshoff for a garage.

Moved by Avery Mead and seconded by Karl Graves to issue a building permit to Rowland Allen for a storage shed.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Avery Mead to grant a Veterans Exemption to Thomas Weatherby in the amount of \$600.00.

The following resolution was offered by Karl Graves and seconded by Avery Mead, who moved its adoption:

RESOLVED that the franchise to operate a cable television system in the Village of Andover granted to Sammons Communications, Inc., is hereby transferred to Sammons Communications of New York, Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Sammons Communications Inc.

Communications were received from the Power Authority of the State of New York, granting the proposed rate increase for the Village of Andover to go into effect on the May 1st billing. This increase is provisional for 15 months contingent upon the required property inventory.

After review, Avery Mead moved and Karl Graves, seconded to accept the tentative budget for the year ending May 31, 1978 and to be set at the following amounts -- General, \$96,948.09; Water, \$13,600; and Electric, \$93,700; and a tentative tax rate of \$40.10 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation be set to raise the amount of \$57,693.55 for the General Fund. Also a public hearing to be held on April 18th at 7 P. M., in the Village Office to make final the tentative budget.

This concluded the business and the meeting was adjourned.
