Local American Legion Post changes name. Some months ago the local American Legion Post voted to request the State Organization to change the name of the local Legion Post from the Thomas M. Lynch Post No. 397 to the Lynch-Burgett Post No. 397 and Adjutant Horton reports this week that the necessary formalities have been completed and the New Charter has been received. The changing of the name of the Post is in honor of the first from Andover to give their lives in the two World Wars. Thomas M. Lynch, World War I and Charles R. Burgett in World War II.
