Greenwood Central School Board has approved the BOCES Service for 1977-78 year. This addition to the Budget will benefit School Psychology Services. This year Dr. Joel Connor of Andover, as Psychologist on a fee basis, adding \$1,000 to the budget. Principals Gary Moore reports as testing only and there are requests for counseling and work with handicapped children. The Board requested BOCES Psychologist one day a week at a cost of \$3,900 including benefits, insurance and salary. In addition, the Board approved \$12,437 expenditure for special education for handicapped children under BOCES in 1977-78 year. I was in the budget this year. Other BOCES Services requested for next year — half-time Agriculture Teacher, a half-time Business Education Teacher, a Driver Education Teacher for 20% of school year, a Speech Therapist for 20% of year, a half-time Guidance Teacher, Instructional Television Media Services, Attendance at the Occupational Center In-Service Training; and Administrative Costs. BOCES shared by participating schools.

The Board received three bids on roofing in response to letters sent to 15 firms. \$29,925 from Charles Evans of Elmira to replace the entire roof; \$11,000 from Hall Roofing Co., Elmira to repair a portion of the roof and replace the fascia around the entire school; \$9,860 from Peterson Roofing Co., C. Olean for a portion of the roof and the fascia. Action was tabled on the bids for further study.

Mr. Moore was authorized to investigate a Comprehensive Employment Training Act Program to provide employment for two or three persons on the Athletic Field and school grounds. Howard Kirsch was appointed Assistant Track Coach for \$200. The purchase of 1977-78 year program was approved at a cost of \$2,400 for Grades K through 6. The evaluation of the Industrial Arts & Agriculture Program was reviewed by the State Education Department and 3 more agriculture programs and including Industrial Arts. This concept will be considered as the Board plans the 1977-78 School Budget and Programs.
