Lee Ryan Enters Legislative Race From District V

Lee R. Ryan of Almond announced his intent to run for the Legislative race from District 5 at the Amity Democratic Dinner at the Belmont Hotel last Saturday night.

Ryan was the first Democrat to announce his candidacy for the Allegany County Board of Legislators. District Five includes the Towns of Alfred, Almond, Amity, Andover, Burns, Ward and West Almond.

He has served on the Board since January of 1970. His present committee assignments are: Health Services, Planning and Historical Public Safety, Rules and Legislation and Workman's Compensation. He also serves on the Office For The Aging Advisory Committee.

He is one of three Allegany County Legislative representatives on the Southern Tier West Regions Planning and Development Board.

Ryan started his political career as an assessor for the Town of

Almond, later serving as Town Justice.

He and his wife, Louise, are the parents of three sons, Lee A. of Almond, Larry of Bath and David of Corning, one daughter, Linda Cornell of Almond.

Ryan was speaker at Saturday night's dinner and spoke on the County Youth Bureau, Revaluation & Assessment, and the creation of a County Watershed Commission.

With only two Democrats on the present Legislative Board, Ryan stressed the need for more to maintain a stronger two-party system.
