

A.C.S. '77 Valedictorian and Salutatorian Named



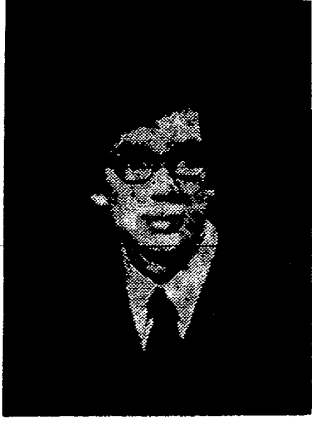
Anita Winslow

Village Board Special Meeting

APRIL 25, 1977

A special meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office April 25, 1977. Those present: Ralph A. Allen, Mayor; Fred Middaugh, Karl Graves, Charles Dain and Ann Appier, Trustees. About 50 interested residents were also in attendance.

The following resolution was offered by Fred Middaugh and seconded by Ann Appier.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JUNE 1, 1977 AND ENDING MAY 31, 1978, MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF VILLAGE GOVERNMENT AND ESTABLISHING THE RATES OF COMPENSATION FOR OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES FOR SUCH PERIOD.

WHEREAS: This Board of Trustees has met at the time and place specified in the notice of the public hearing on the tentative budget.

WHEREAS: The final revisions have been made on the budget.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the revised budget as hereinafter set forth and a copy attached to these minutes, is hereby adopted and that the several amounts stated in the budget be and they are hereby APPROPRIATED FOR THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES SPECIFIED AND THE wages stated in such budget shall be and hereby fixed at the amounts shown therein effective June 1, 1977.

This resolution adopted by the following votes: Fred Middaugh Aye, Ann Appier Aye, Charles Dain Nay, Karl Graves Nay, Ralph A. Allen Aye. Carried.

The revised tax rate for 77/78 is \$40.00 per \$1,000 of assessed value. Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Charles Dain to adopt the following resolution.

WHEREAS: The County Treasurer has recommended that the Village of Andover agree to accept \$200.00 from Thomas Smith in payment of taxes owing on the Thorp Bldg and \$34.00 from Neil Javors on the Cliff Nye property to satisfy back taxes, and

WHEREAS: The Village needs to receive such revenue and to have the property sold to a new owner to continue to receive taxes.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Village will accept the request of the County Treasurer and accept payment offered. (letter of intent from Thomas Smith attached to minutes).

This resolution adopted by the following votes: Fred Middaugh Aye, Ann Appier Aye, Charles Dain Aye, Karl Graves Aye. Carried.

This concluded the business and the meeting was adjourned.

We are happy to report that the news we reported last week is now official! In a letter received Tuesday morning from Allegany County Manpower Programs located at Belmont, it states in part: "Your projects regarding the drainage problem and the water line have been approved and you have either already been contacted in their regard or will be shortly."

Thus hopefully, if things go as scheduled, we will be able to get started in a couple of weeks.

In addition to the regular routine of reading meters, and taking care of Electric and Water Department problems, we have a repair and maintenance problem that is going to have to be taken care of before we can get underway with our construction problems. New brakes are going to have to be installed on the dump truck by our own personnel, and the front-end on the pick-up is going to have to be repaired since a four-wheel drive vehicle is much more costly to drive and maintain — especially when that vehicle is used to plow snow with — something that it wasn't designed for. However with no money in the budget for any new vehicles, the only alternative is to repair our present vehicles to a state where they are safe to drive and safe on the highway.

News Briefs of Local Servicemen

Navy Hull Maintenance Technician Third Class Kenneth W. Geer, son of Mr. and Mrs. Milton L. Geer of Route 2, Rochambeau Ave., Ext., Andover, N. Y., recently participated in Exercise "Solid Shield 77." He is serving as a crewmember aboard the amphibious assault ship USS Guadalcanal homeported in Norfolk, Va.

The two-week joint exercise was conducted in the Atlantic coastal waters off North Carolina and Georgia and at nearby military installations. More than 40,000 men and women from all branches of the Armed Forces including 3,000 Reservists, participated. Twenty-two ships from the U. S. Second Fleet, commanded by Vice Admiral John J. Shanahan, plus carrier and land based Navy and Marine Corps aircraft joined with units of the Army's Forces Command, a Marine Amphibious Brigade and units from the Air Force's Tactical Air Command and Military Airlift Command for "Solid Shield."

The exercise was under the overall command of Admiral Isaac C. Kidd Jr., USN, the commander-in-chief, Atlantic. "Solid Shield" is a major annual exercise designed to provide training in joint operations for a multi-service force. This year's exercise included air, naval and ground operations and a large scale amphibious assault.

A 1974 graduate of Andover Central High School, Geer joined the Navy in August 1974.

The meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order at 8:00 P. M. May 31, 1977. The meeting was moved to the School Cafeteria so that more room could be available for others persons that were in attendance.

Virginia Milligan was sworn in as Board member to fill William Walker's term.

Virginia Milligan made the motion and Conner Stephens seconded, that Mary K. Slade act as Clerk of the Board until the Reorganizational Meeting in July. Passed by 3 yes votes.

The resignation of H Dale Green from the Board of Education was read. Motion to accept the resignation with regret was made by Mary K. Slade, seconded by Conner Stephens. Passed by 3 yes votes.
