On June 21, 1977, there will be a hearing at 7:30 p. m., to discuss the proposed revised school budget for the 77-78 school year totaled at \$1,111,637.77, with an estimated increase of \$1.86 per thousand of assessed value. Included in the \$1.85 tax increase is money for a Registered Nurse.

In addition the discussed proposition on reinstating the school nurse teacher will be presented. If the school nurse teacher position is reinstated it will cost \$12,541.26 or a 2.33 tax increase per thousand of assessed value.

On June 22, 1977 between the hours of 12:00 - 8:00 p. m., citizens of Andover will be able to vote on this Budget and proposition in the foyer of the school gym.
