School Budget Approved Wed.

The stormy, twice-recessed sec ond Andover School District Meeting of the year, was finally concluded Wednesday evening with the amended budget being approved by a vote of '295 yes; 115 no.

This budget amounting to \$1,111,637 was carried by a plurality of 185 votes raising the tax rate \$1,85 per thousand, assessed valuation with 410 people voting.

The advisory proposition to restore the nurse-teacher position was approved by a vote of 264 yes; 150 no, with a total of 414 votes cast. This position was restored by the School Board at a meeting held after the district election and will raise the tax rate an additional \$2,35 per thousand assessed valuation.

Thus, after over a month of strife and controvers.

Thus, after over a month of strife and controversy, the School Budget remains practically the same as the original budget with the exception of the deletion of one item acounting to \$5,000.
