Andover Lions Club Five Year Report

At the conclusion of Service to the Community thru the terms of five Lions Presidents since chartering on February 26, 1972, the Andover Lions Club presents the following report so that members of the Community can graphically understand what their support of the local Lions Club has accomplished.

The Lions Club, in its mission of Sight, handled 14 cases in this area; held 4 lazy eye clinics; assisted 5 cases needing glasses; helped the Batavia School for the Blind six times; purchased sight aids; donated a Large Print Subscription of the Readers Digest to the Library; and assisted 3 times in the Leader Dog Foundation.

Within the scope of the Club's secondary mission which is hearing, the Club has held 2 Hearing Clinics and assisted 3 persons with hearing problems.

Under the Lions Club "Youth Program", the Club has sponsored the Girls Scouts all 5 years; sent a local youth to the Ithaca Speech Clinic; assisted in local Speech Therapy program; established and maintained a College Scholarship as an annual program; conducted an annual Easter Egg Hunt for Tots; sponsored youths at a Basketball Clinic; sent young people to a Conservation Camp; donated to the F.H.A., National Honor Society, Boy Scouts, Youth Baseball, Cheer Leaders, Spanish Club, Crippled Children Fund; and sponsored a Leo's Club.

With its "on-going" Community Service Program, the Club donated an E.K.G. Machine to the Medical Center; Portable Bleachers for the High School; assisted in the Flood Clean-up in 1972; and installed Glass Backboards for the School Basketball Court; Organized and Sponsored the Annual Allegany-Stauben Maple Festival; conducted several Ecology projects; established an Annual World Service Day to help Senior Citizens; held Environmental Programs; purchased and distributed Thanksgiving and Christmas Baskets to underprivileged residents annually; donated an Eye-Testing Machine to the School; as well as an Audiometer for testing hearing; conducted an annual "Toys for Tots" program at Christmas Time; sponsored an Annual Christmas Decorating Contest in the Village; helped pay for the new Christmas Lights and Decorations for the Village; sponsored Patriotic Projects; aided Fire Victims; held Hunter Safety Courses and Snow-Mobile courses; and also purchased and made available for local use 12 banquet tables.

The Club has also donated funds or assisted several Churches and many Groups and Organizations including: Fourth of July Committee; Sesqui-Centennial; Rod & Gun Club; Ye Hubbards Cupboard; Y.M.C.A.; Fire Department; Senior Citizens; School Band Uniforms Fund; Red Cross; Salvation Army; Barber Shop Quartet; Heart Fund; Migrant Center at Geneseo; P.T.A.; Chamber of Commerce; and Rescue Squad; as well as participated in the Annual Fourth of July Celebration.

In addition, the Club purchased a large tent that has been used by many local Organizations, and has sponsored many International Lions Club Projects which does not come out of local activity funds but from funds derived from Lion Club Members.

As far as actual figures are concerned, in the past year, Lions Members donated 5,201 man-hours to these projects and \$5,441.11 in actual cash; and, over the five years of existence, the Members have contributed 23,210 man-hours in projects, and \$25,303.45 in finances in actual contributions.

More over, all five Presidents have received the 100% President's Award from Lions International and the Club received the designation as "Number One Club in District 20E-1" in one of those 5 years!
