faculty and families will be paid by the employer. An across the board increase of \$100 will be given for all coaching and extra curricular assignments. Starting salary for a teacher with a bachelor degree will be \$8,400. The agreement with the non-teaching staff was announced jointly by Michael Sky, President of the group and Principal Moore. Salary increases will be between 5 and 8 per cent depending on the category of employment. Bus Drivers will be given an increase from \$2,500 to \$3,000 for those with morning and afternoon runs. There will be a \$100 increase the second year. Hourly employees will be given a 20 per cent increase in 1978-79 and a second 20 per cent increase in 1979-80. There will be some increases in health and life insurance coverage in some employment categories and no change in others. Board ratification of the contracts was made at the meeting Monday night.

In other action the Board received a five year Physical Education Plan prepared by Richard Smith, scheduled a meeting June 29 to complete financial transactions for the school year, and approved employment of Lillian Spencer for the remainder of June and two weeks in July to help with accounts, requisitions and other office work. She has been employed as attendance officer under the CETA Program and the funds for the position have been spent.
