A special meeting of the Greenwood Central School Board of Education was held on June 29, 1977 at 8:00 P. M. to pay the bills for the end of the 1976-77 school year.

The following actions were also taken:

Moving of the High School Library to the Commercial Room and the Commercial Room to the Library and placing Mrs. Virginia York as a full time library Media Center Specialist. One full time Library Aid position will be eliminated.

Permission was given to hire a full time Special Needs Teacher as required by legislation created two or three years ago. Up until now we have had a half-time position.

Mr. Richard Smith was appointed to the position of Vice-Principal. Mr. Smith is Physical Education Teacher at Greenwood. He holds his Master's Degree in Education Administration from Brockport along with being certified in Physical Education.

Mr. Smith replaced Raymond Duke as Vice-Principal and Mrs. Shirley Cook as Elementary Coordinator. A new role will be played by the Vice-Principal.

The Petty Cash Fund was increased from \$50 to \$75. Authorization was given to transfer money to the Lunch Account until such time as we receive State Aid which is 2 or 3 months behind.

Item 1 for 1977-78 was approved in the amount of \$1270.

Dr. Richard McDonald, District Superintendent met with the Board of Education to establish the procedures for seeking a replacement for Gary Moore, Supervising Principal. Applications will be accepted until the 15th of July. The Board of Education will meet on the 15th to review the applications and interviews will be set up shortly thereafter. Moore will be going to Cuba Central School on or about August 1, 1977.

Mrs. Patricia Higgins attended her last meeting of the Board of Education after 5 years of very helpful membership on the Board. A resolution from the Board of Education was entered in the minutes thanking her for her contributions to the School and the Board of Education.

Mrs. Donna Pritchard will replace Mrs. Higgins effective July 1. Discussion followed on finding a replacement for Mr. Arnold Gettelf, 7th and 8th Grade Social Studies Teacher who resigned effective June 30, 1977. Mr. Moore indicated he has notified the college placement offices and applications will be accepted until July 15.

Ernest Kinner was hired to replace Kenneth Vars as bus driver/mechanic.
