

School Board Holds Special Meetings

A Special Meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order at 7:58 in the ACS Principal's Office by the President, Conner Stephens, on August 23, 1977. Members present: Conner Stephens, Mary K. Slade, Virginia Milligan, Paul McCormick and Richard Godown. Others present: Joan Dibble, Jean Dunham, Marjorie Goodridge, Jane Troxell, Joyce Harris and Charity McCormick.

The Oath of office was administered by Conner Stephens to Richard Godown. Conner Stephens apologized for the late notice of the meeting. The Board went into executive session to discuss pay schedules. The Board came out of Executive Session at 11:20.

The Board asked Mr. Jordan what phones would be in use for faculty and students this year. Mr. Jordan informed them that there would be three supervised phones for use in the building, one in the Guidance Office, one in the Nurse's Office and one upstairs in Mr. Russell's Office.

Paul McCormick made the motion that Frank Russell attend the Board of Education meetings. Motion seconded by Richard Godown. Motion passed with 4 yes votes and one abstention. Mrs. Slade felt it took away from Mr. Jordan's authority if this motion went into effect. Later in the meeting it was established that the Board did not want to make it mandatory that Mr. Russell attend all meetings but would like to have him attend when they wanted to discuss disciplinary problems.

Mr. Jordan suggested we have Ethel Kelley at the Board Meetings for finance subjects that might arise in future meetings. The Board was reminded that the regular meetings will be the second Tuesday of each month.

Resolution to appoint Robert McEnroe to a three year probationary position of 7 - 9 grade Social Studies in the tenure area of secondary Social Studies on the sixth step at the master's level for a salary of \$11,300 was made by Conner Stephens and seconded by Mary K. Slade. Passed by 5 yes votes. Meeting was adjourned at 11:32.

Title II bills totaling \$3,649.22 as certified by Mr. Jordan were approved for payment. Mary K. Slade made the motion and Paul McCormick seconded. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Resolution was made by Mary K. Slade and seconded by Paul McCormick that the Ice Cream Bid from Perry's be accepted for the 1977-78 school year. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Rochambeau Avenue project is completed, with the grading all done, and some of the new seeding is already growing so that is one big head-ache out of the way.

The replacement water line project on East Greenwood Street has already been started and should be completed within six weeks so please excuse any temporary inconvenience of having the sidewalk area dug up - the improvement will be permanent. The residents up that way should be able to turn on their faucets in the near future - and actually get water - not a lot of air! However, there may be a few small problems arise when the house services are connected to the new water main, as there is no way of knowing what condition these lines are in until they are dug up.

The paving project on Grove Street is scheduled to start in another week or so and if the Contractor keeps his promise, that should be completed and out of the way before winter sets in.

The Wellsville Electric Department is helping us out with our needs in the Electric Department and their crew intends to come up Sat. and take the Village primary lines down over the new Fir Hill and tie in the new lines by-passing that area. This just leave, two more jobs to be completed on the following weekend, weather permitting.

In other areas, we are devoting our attention to seek a solution to the drainage problem on Water Street so that we will be able to make some permanent improvements on the Water Street pavement and hopefully get the hot patches to remain in place instead of washing out all the time.

New York State Dept. of Health Law Amended

Albany, Sept. 2 - Dr. Robert P. Whalen, State Health Commissioner, today reminded parents that children who are entering school for the first time must be properly protected against mumps as a result of a recent change in the Public Health Law.

Dr. Whalen said that Section 2164 of the Law was amended to require first-time school enterers including those entering day care or nursery schools, to be immunized against mumps in addition to the formerly required protection against diphtheria, polio, measles and rubella.

"Our most recent immunization status survey showed that during the past school year, 91% of school enterers upstate were adequately immunized against Polio and Rubella and 92% were protected against measles and diphtheria," the commissioner pointed out. "While these statistics are encouraging, there is still room for improvement. It is up to each parent to see that his or her child is properly protected against these childhood illnesses which can have such devastating effects on young lives."

Dr. Whalen noted that while the law requires children entering school to be immunized, health experts recommend that immunizations be administered at the earliest possible date. He said most of the childhood diseases are likely to cause the most severe consequences between the ages of one and four.

Dr. Whalen said immunizations should begin as early as two months old, particularly for pertussis or whooping cough which frequently causes death among infants below the age of one.

The commissioner urged parents to check their children's health records to make sure that they are fully protected. He noted that school principals are responsible for seeing to it that inadequately immunized children are not allowed to enter school. He said immunized children should be taken to the doctor or local health department without delay.

Dr. Whalen said that parents who have questions about immunization such as when particular immunizations should be administered, will find the State Health Department leaflet, "Immunize Now", to be most helpful. The leaflet may be obtained by writing to Publications State Health Department, 14th Floor, Empire State Plaza Tower, Albany, 12237, or may be picked up at county health department offices.
