Village Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office August 8th at 7:30 P. M. Those present: Ralph A. Allen, Mayor; Karl Graves and Ann Appier, Trustees; David Rossman and Mr. Richard Holt.

Minutes of the meeting held July 11th were read and approved on a motion made by Karl Graves and seconded by Ann Appier.

Mr. Richard Holt, Senior Building Construction Engineer for the State Housing and Building Code Council was present to discuss the adoption of building codes for the Village of Andover. At present the Village has no building codes and Mr. Holt believes that this would expedite the issuance of building permits. The Board will study the State Code and discuss it at a special meeting to be held August 22nd.

The following resolution was moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Ann Appier:

Whereas: The Village of Andover has no building codes at the present time and

Whereas: The Village should have building codes.

Now Therefore: hereafter the construction of all future buildings in the Village of Andover, must have the plans and designs drawn up by a contractor, architect, or competent building designer.

A letter of resignation from Superintendent David Rossman was received effective August 19th. Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Ann Appier, to accept this with regret.

Supt. Rossman reported that the electric is completed on the Joyce Management project, the Fire Hall is almost completed and the men are working on the ditch on Rochambeau Ave.

The Clerk was instructed to notify our insurance agent about the claim from Donald Saxe as to the damage done to his swimming pool which he considered the Village's responsibility because of the ditch started by the Village in back of his property.

Street repair was discussed and was recommended that Grove Street be done as discussed and provided for in the budget. Bids on street work will be opened August 22nd. This is also for the patching of streets where needed and the ditching on Hill Street and some grading work to be done on Fairview Ave.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Ann Appier to employ Robert Strimble as a full time Police Officer for the Village with the understanding that if it is necessary for Mr. Strimble to attend basic Police Training School that this expense will be paid by the Village of Andover. Mr. Strimble should be on the job by September 12th.

The drainage problem on Water Street was discussed and the Mayor will meet with the Health Department this week to try to find a solution.

Moved by Ann Appier and seconded by Karl Graves to accept the following Police Report for the month of July: Complaints 19, Investigations 21, Misc. Calls and requests 4, Accidents 3, Doors and Windows found open 2, Total Arrests 7, (traffic 3, criminal 3, Village ordinance 1), Parking Summons issued 2, Assists to other Agencies 8, Property Checks 3, Court Appearances 2, Patrolman Bissell's hours 124, Patrolman Witter's hours 130, Mileage on Patrol Vehicle 47755, month of June and July 2734.

Abstract No. 3 of 77/78 was audited and approved for payment in the following amounts: General \$14,085.58, Water \$458.50, and Electric \$9,362.02.

Bids as advertised were opened for the paving program. Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Charles Dain to accept the bid of Allegany Bitumens in the amount of \$13,000 for Grove St., (only bid).

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Charles Dain, to issue a building permit, on recommendation by Harold Joyce, building inspector, to Ronald Glover to construct a factory manufactured home on his lot on Roch. Ave.

Moved by Ann Appier and seconded by Karl Graves, to issue a building permit, on recommendation by Harold Joyce, building inspector, to Mrs. Helen Stephens to construct a porch and storage barn on their lot on North Main St., with the stipulation that the service pole and anchor and water from the curb box, becomes the responsibility of the property owner.

Moved by Charles Dain and seconded by Karl Graves, to issue a building permit, on recommendation by Harold Joyce, building inspector, to Duane Cook to build an addition onto his home on Water St.

Mr. Barry Rohrabacher was present and interviewed for the job of Supt. of Public Works. Karl Graves moved, seconded by Ann Appier that Mr. Rohrabacher be hired at a salary of \$11,570 per year, Blue Cross and Blue Shield and retirement, with a probationary period of 6 months.

A motion by Lee Meyn and seconded by Harry Kemp to accept the July 14, 1977 minutes as read Carried.

Supervisor Burdick reported that the following Bridges have been painted: East Valley, Rochambeau Ave., North Main and Water Street Bridges.

Three Building Permits were granted to Lloyd Hollenbeck, Robert Payne, Robert Lovewell, Kenneth Neuse, Ronald Braunschiedel and to William Deming.

The Mayor's Column

"Red" Allen

This week certainly started out as a busy one with the regular monthly meeting of the Village Board on Monday evening, storm warnings and flash flooding Tuesday evening, and electrical problems Wednesday evening.

Despite the fact that the Village Crew picked up the leaves and trash around the storm sewer drains Tuesday, the torrential rain that evening washed more leaves down off the trees which covered up the drains which acted like stoppers and we had curb-to-curb ponds all over the Village Streets. However, under the supervision of one of the Village Board Members, a member of the Village Crew and several interested Citizens the problem was resolved.

"Chuck" Dain reports that Dan Perkins helped him during the storm until all the drains were cleared and that his pick-up truck was almost full of leaves when they ended up. In the meanwhile, Ken Lehman was called out with the Village Truck, working in other areas along with the assistance of other interested citizens including former Mayor Jim Bliss who was afraid the water would run into his basement. Taxpayer participation is certainly appreciated in a time of emergency like this.

Then Wednesday evening after we returned from a Dyke Creek Water Shed meeting in Belmont our attention was called to an electrical problem up on Grove Street which made it necessary to call out our electrician to check out the situation.

In speaking of the water shed meeting in Belmont, it reminded us that we attended a water shed meeting in Wellsville on August 25th, and were made aware of the comprehensive water shed study that had been made by the State Soil Conservation Service which includes the use of small earthen impoundments to hold back flood waters until the rain storms subside. This certainly seems like a sensible approach to the problem and appears to be worthy of further study — especially since a program like this is 100% funded by Federal Funds.

We also recently attended a meeting with Niagara Mohawk Officials who discussed the details route, construction, etc., for the new proposed power line from Wellsville to Andover and the location of their new sub-station here in Andover. The Corporation was kind enough to furnish us with detailed maps of the proposed route so if any local property owner feels that they will be involved in their plans — they are welcome to stop in at The News Office and arrangements will be made so that they can check over the plans.
