**Missionary Convention
At Alliance Church**

An American woman with a lifetime of missionary teaching and evangelism in Colombia, South America, will take part in a missionary convention at the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church located at Rochambeau Avenue Andover.

The convention will run from Sunday, September 18 through Wednesday, September 21. The public is invited to attend all presentations at 7:30 p. m., daily and at 11:00 a. m. and 7:30 p. m. on Sunday, September 18.

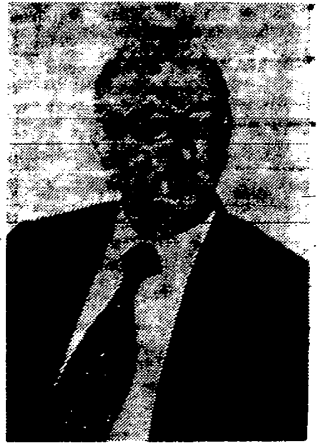
Miss Marjorie Jones is completing more than thirty years of service among the Hispanic and Indian people of Colombia. She was among the first evangelical Protestant missionaries to work in that tropical country.

At first, she experienced harsh persecution, facing all alone the hostility of state religious organizations. As she recalls those years she also remembers, "How God protected!" But, in recent years, she has witnessed the phenomenal growth of new churches and Christian schools in Colombia.

Children and their education have been her special concern. Miss Jones has taught at several schools — including the Central Bible Institute at Armenia, the Indian Bible Institute at Ambachico and the Jorge Isaac Christian school. Recently she pioneered in organizing night classes at the

Central Bible Institute. She has also been active working with local churches, with women's groups and in the writing of missionary material.

The Andover Alliance Church is a member of The Christian and Missionary Alliance, a worldwide missionary and evangelical church denomination founded in 1887. Today the C.M.A. has a church constituency of over one million people in the United States, Canada and 41 other countries. In 1975, the Alliance missionary fields are served by over 900 missionaries.

The Rev. John Schultz, a Dutch missionary among the primitive tribes of Irian Jaya, Indonesia, is also expected here next week to speak at the Annual Missionary Convention.

Mr. Schultz, with The Christian and Missionary Alliance, is a teacher at the Kebo Bible School of Irian Jaya. Originally from Haarlem, Holland, he shared during World War II his family's experience of persecution and starvation under the Nazi occupation.

After the war, he underwent a profound transformation in his life at the age of twenty when, in a Christian fellowship, he committed his life to Jesus Christ.

One year later, during an evangelistic campaign in 1951, he felt drawn to full-time Christian service. This led him to studies at the Brussels Bible Institute in Belgium. While there he learned of the Christian and Missionary Alliance
