Blanche Meehan, 73, of Edgeview Estates, Hornell, RD 1, was dead on arrival at the St. James Mercy Hospital, Saturday, September 24, 1977, after her car hit a bridge abutment on Route 248, a mile north of Rexville. Sgt. Jerry Darrt Steuben County Sheriff Department, said she was driving north about 145 p. m., in the Town of West Union, when her car went off the highway, crossing the road and hit the bridge. The Greenwood Ambulance was called and took her to the hospital. After the Sheriff's investigation, Bill O'Hagan towed her car to his garage. Dr. A. Byron Collins, Steuben County Coroner, had not decided the cause of death at the time.

She was a native of Genesee, Pa., and lived in Hornell since 1943. She was a communicant of St. Ann's Church and a member of the Legion of Mary.

She was the widow of John F. Meehan, and is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Evelyn Voorhes of Wellsville and Miss Dorothy Meehan of Hornell; two sons, Francis J. Meehan of Rexville and Gerald F. Meehan of Canisteo; two sisters, Mrs. Sara Jackson of Blossburg, Pa., and Mrs. Agnes McAllister of Wellsville; 13 grandchildren and 16 great grandchildren.

Friends were received at Dagar Funeral Home, Hornell, Sunday evening and Monday. A prayer service was held there at 10:30 a. m., Tuesday and 11 a. m. Mass of Christian Burial at St. Ann's. Burial was in St. Mary's Cemetery, Rexville.
