The six-week Allegany County Tax Sale publication for the 1977 unpaid taxes will start October 19, 1977. The Tax Sale is to be held in the County Treasurer's Office November 30, 1977, at 10:00 A. M. As we have over seven hundred and eighty parcels (780) that have not been paid. I am urging everyone who received their September billing, which was mailed September 22nd, to remit their payment to us as soon as possible. By doing so, they may avoid being listed in the publication and chaving additional advertising cost added to their taxes.

In addition to the 177 delinquentaxes, we have, at this time, one hundred and ninety-five (195) unpaid 1976 Tax Sale Certificates sixty-two (62) unpaid 1976 Tax Sale Certificates.

If anyone has an tapaid 1977 Tax Sale Certificate issued agains their property, they should dowhatever is possible to see that it is paid before November 21, 1977 If the 1974 Tax Sale Certificate remain unpaid after this date, then those parcels will be available to the public to bid on.
